# Life Together

Happy New Year! I love the verse that is read at Epiphany from Isaiah 60.1: "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you." It holds so much promise and possibility that it sounds like it could have been written at the beginning of a new year, millennia ago.

The first word – "arise" – calls us to action. In other words, Get up! Look up! Lift up your hearts! As we begin a New Year, we can be consumed with what has (or hasn't) been, or with anxiety about what is to be. And, yet, the command "arise" helps us change our outlook. It calls for a different posture, and as the famous and late theologian Jimmy Buffet says: "changes in latitudes bring changes in attitudes." If you look to God's possibilities, you begin to see in a different way. Anne Lamont frequently quotes a Catholic priest who said: "Sometimes heaven is a new pair of glasses."

The second imperative is "shine" – which implies that you have the ability to participate in the glory of God. Jesus says that God's people are the light of the world, and that is true especially in the ministries of FPC Huntsville, as you continue to engage in meaningful service, worship, and fellowship in all the ways in which God calls you in 2025.

More than New Year's resolutions, a new way is seen, not just of self-improvements for a New Year, but of God-intentions of transformations for a new reality. We see God's lovingkindness,

God's faithfulness, that light shining in the darkness which the darkness did not overcome. And guess what? Your radiance is essential to any bright future of God's own imagining.
